

Dear Friends and Family of Oak Grove.

When I was a kid we lived in Arkansas. Every year during Christmas break we would drive to Morristown to be with family. It was a 12+ hour trip. My sisters and I would get really excited to cross over the Mississippi River at Memphis and see the Tennessee state sign over head. We had it in our minds that once we were in Tennessee we had to be close to Granny's house. Dad understood we were still 8 hours away. When we asked how much longer he loved to reply 10 more minutes.

As we begin to cross the next step in the process of dealing with the virus we are asking the question, "How much longer?" We have moved from no service to online service. Then we moved from online service to drive-in service. Now we are about to have our first inside service. Along the way I have been excited to see how the people of this church have stepped up to help neighbors, help people in need in our community, minister to grieving families, and try out new forms of small group.

I have also been amazed at how God has moved so strongly in different forms of worship. When the church started online services during Pastor Benny's time here, there were just a few views each week. Now, hundreds and at times we have thousands of views for a single service. I believe that will continue far into the future. When we started having drive-in service, we were not sure how many people would attend. Amazingly, we have had 65-75 cars each week. That probably equates to 125-175 people. (A quick thank you to all of our sound people and parking lot workers that serve faithfully each week.) Not only are people attending, we are having visitors and the response I receive from attendees has been overwhelmingly positive. As one person said, "Having service outside and worshiping God while seeing the sky and birds and all that He has created is amazing." It has been a huge success. We intend to keep having this option as long as people are still attending and finding it helpful.

Now we are looking to add an inside service. It's the next step on the journey. Many people are looking forward to attending an inside service. Others, are more than a little cautious, and that is understandable. As we move inside, we know things will be different. In the beginning we will not have a choir. Doug is doing a great job with the praise team. I really enjoy the way he is switching people so we can hear from many of our choir members. We will practice safe distancing for attendees. At every turn we will be attempting to keep everyone as safe as possible.

The leadership team has been meeting regularly and building a process for returning safely. As a result they agreed to adopt 10 practices we will be following for inside services.

- 1. Sign in --- We are having everyone sign in so we can respond quickly if there were an attendee who tested positive. Everyone is going to want to know as soon as possible.
- 2. Temperature Taken --- We will be taking everyone's temperature with a non-contact forehead thermometer. Someone may think they have allergies when in fact, they may have the flu. For this reason, we want to keep everyone safe and allow people who have a temperature to attend at a later date.
- 3. Orderly seating --- I know everyone has a favorite spot for nesting. Unfortunately our sanctuary that normally holds more than five hundred will be reduced to holding less than half the normal amount. In an effort to safely distance and still seat the most people possible, we will be ushering everyone to a seat.
- 4. Stay seated --- We will be reminding everyone to remain seated until the end of service. We realize most people have not seen each other in weeks and would like to reacquaint, but for everyone to be confident and safe, we will not be able to move around.
- 5. Orderly Exit --- We will be releasing everyone by row at the end of service. This is to help congregants remain a safe distance from others.
- 6. Masks are Available --- We have chosen not to make masks mandatory. However, we do encourage people to wear them, particularly if they have allergies and are sneezing a lot.
- 7. Offering Recepticals in the Vestibule --- We feel that safest practices mean not passing the offering plate. The less everyone touches common items, the safer everyone feels.
- 8. Removal of Hymnals, Bibles, and envelopes from the back of pews --- This is in an effort to cut down on the number of touches an item receives.
- 9. Bulletins on Pews --- We will lay a bulletin in each seat so everyone can have one, and they are handled as little as possible.
- 10. Illness Reminders --- We want to consistently remind everyone to stay home and watch the service on social media or listen over the phone if they feel under the weather in any way. What you may think is an allergy could be a bigger problem. We will all feel better if everyone who feels bad remains at home until they feel better.

We want to say thank you ahead of time for helping us use the safest practices possible. We hope that by enduring a little inconvenience now, we will show the world that we care about people. It is simply a different way to show love.

Finally, for those of us asking, "How much longer?" The answer is still the same, "Ten more minutes." Thank you for your patience, ministry, and encouragement during this time. May God continue to bless us in a mighty way.




