Dear Family and Friends,

There have been several moments throughout this pandemic that I have witnessed God's touch. One of the most amazing has been in the generosity of Christians. When the virus first hit, denominational and state conventions were concerned that there would be a significant drop in giving because churches were having to stop having services. Several meetings and projections were prepared for how the convention and state leaders would handle anticipated shortfalls. The results would have been devastating to many ministries across the country.

Then God's people stepped up. In the convention giving has remained close to 95% of what it was last year. The Tennessee Baptist Mission Board recorded one of the largest Golden State Offerings ever received for the 12 months that ended August 31st, and this year I think we could even exceed that number. Our church has challenged itself to \$4,500. The Golden State offering is a particular offering we take up each year. The proceeds from the offering go directly to mission work in the state of Tennessee. It makes a massive difference for people in our state.

In our church, giving has remained strong. We want to say a huge thank you to every person who has been faithful to give during this time. Your offerings have kept missionaries on the mission fields worldwide and helped victims of floods, hurricanes, and tornadoes here in the United States. Southern Baptist fixed 477,000 meals since March for those affected by the storms. As a church, you have helped people with personal needs, food needs, and shelter. It has been amazing to witness God's people be so generous during such a volatile time. Thank you for your faithfulness to give.

October will bring about new steps in our journey through the pandemic. We have worked hard to meet people where they are on the journey. Our drive-in service is still doing very well with more than 50 cars this past week. Our inside service is growing. We had over 95 people this past week worshiping in the Sanctuary.

The church council and deacon leadership met last night, and we are moving forward with new changes. Starting October 4th, we will begin offering a nursery, Sunday School for all ages at 9:45, children's church, and the second Sunday of October, Jericho Junction will resume. We will continue to have the drive-in service, but the beginning time will change to 9:45, so it will be simultaneous with Sunday School. If you are going to Sunday School, we ask that you park behind the Gym. If you have trouble walking, we have people who will park your car for you. Just pull up to the covered area. The drive-in service will continue on the front parking lots. The drive-in service provides a ministry to people concerned with meeting face to face and will continue as long as there is a need. If we have bad weather on a Sunday morning, we may need to cancel for that particular Sunday, but as long as people attend, we will continue providing the opportunity.

When it comes to safety, we are trying to take as many appropriate precautions as possible. Masks are still encouraged but are not going to be required. We will be attempting to social distance in the classes, and we will limit the number of people who can be in a particular room. Eric will teach an overflow Sunday School class on the mezzanine for anyone unable to get into their regular class or for any class that does not have a teacher on a particular Sunday. The nursery will have specific guidelines sent to parents and signs posted on the doors so people will know what to expect. These are critical next steps, and we look forward to seeing all that God does. Thank you for your help and your prayers as we journey together in these unusual days.
