Luke 14

15 Now when one of those who sat at the table with Him (**Jesus**) heard these things, he said to Him, “Blessed is he who shall eat bread in the kingdom of God!”

16 Then He said to him, “A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, 17 and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, ‘Come, for all things are now ready.’ 18 But they all with one accord began to make excuses. The first said to him, ‘I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.’ 19 And another said, ‘I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.’ 20 Still another said, ‘I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.’ 21 So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house, being angry, said to his servant, ‘Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor and the maimed and the lame and the blind.’ 22 And the servant said, ‘Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room.’ 23 Then the master said to the servant, ‘Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. 24 For I say to you that none of those men who were invited shall taste my supper.’ ”

Imagine having a great party and no one you loved enough to invite was willing to attend. You thought a great deal of them, but they do not feel the same about you. It would hurt, really hurt. I am sure they would profusely apologize if you went to each of those people and told them how you had looked forward and planned and prepared for them to have a great time. When you told them your feelings had been hurt, they would apologize and reassure you they meant no harm. If you told them how you suddenly realized your friendship was not as strong as you had believed, they may go out of their way to assure you the friendship is still strong.

The problem is, no matter what they said after the fact, their actions had spoken louder than their words. Ask any Christian, and they will tell you they love God. They may tell you about a time when God came through in a challenging situation. Stories of the previous relationship with God would give evidence after evidence of how strong their relationship is with God. Unfortunately, the latest studies don’t show proof of a current relationship. By 2050 Christianity will become a minority belief system in America. What will be number one in 2050? Nothing... the number one belief system in America in 2050 will be people who do not believe in any religion. These people believe there is no God and could care less about relationships, salvation, or even forgiveness of sins.

Apathy is the greatest threat to Christianity. It is not the Mormons, Hinduism, Muslims, or any religion you can think of; it is apathy. Apathy happens when Christians find another way to spend their Sundays. Sports, entertainment, vacations, camping, shopping, or just lying in bed; none of these things are wrong. I could argue that under the right circumstances, these things are all good things to be part of a person’s life. The danger comes when these things replace time spent in God’s house with God’s people. God never intended Christianity to be a spectator experience.

So how do we change the direction of this country? Be the one who chooses to attend worship and small group every week. Be the person who brings a friend, acquaintance, or random person you meet at a gas pump. Be the person who chooses to engage, encourage, participate, and stand in the gap so others can attend church. You see, the difference maker in this church will always be you. Please make time for God and spend time with His people. The body of Christ needs you to choose to engage. Thank you for all you do. Thank you for attending Oak Grove. Thank you for encouraging others to attend church with you.
