

# A Note from the Pastor

#### Key verses Matthew 16:24-27

24 Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. 25 For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it. 26 For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul? 27 For the Son of Man will come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and then He will reward each according to his works.

### Dear Family and Friends.

As we move forward into a different "normal" in this time of a pandemic, it has occurred to me we are asked to sacrifice a great many things. For parents, we sacrifice a great deal of time from work or other duties to care for our children, who would typically be in school. Doctors and nurses sometimes sacrifice safety to care for our community at large. Police and firefighters who have always had jobs of sacrifice now give more and more daily. Many people sacrifice in some way so that others are safer, provided significant opportunities, or have a greater sense of peace.

Christianity has been about sacrifice from the very beginning. No one person has ever had a greater sacrifice than Jesus Christ. He gave his life for people who did not love Him, care for Him, and at times hated Him. He sacrificed time in Heaven, power, and His physical body so that you and I could know God. He illustrated for us the importance of sacrifice.

As a church, we have taken temperatures, worshiped outside, sat in different seats and worn masks. We have sacrificed some areas of our "rights" or "freedoms" so that other people feel safer in attending worship. Our church has chosen to sacrifice some small things in the short term so our community will be safer in the long run. Thank you for your choice to sacrifice your comfort, even when you may not agree so that others will know you love them. "Sacrifice" is what Christianity is all about. I want to leave you with a short illustration I found today. I hope you enjoy it.

"On May 2, 1962, Gladys Kidd placed a dramatic advertisement in the San Francisco Examiner, "I don't want my husband to die in the gas chamber for a crime he did not commit. I will therefore offer my services for 10 years as a cook, maid, or housekeeper to any leading attorney who will defend him and bring about his vindication."

Vincent Hallinan, one of San Francisco's best lawyers saw the advertisement, felt pity, and contacted the woman. He took on the case and ended up getting the innocent man released from all charges. Afterward, the attorney refused the lady's offer of ten years of service, noting that he was satisfied to have saved an innocent man from death.

One of the most touching shows of humanity is selfless love. Stories of kindhearted humans helping others with no kickback or reward offsets the grimness of news and gives hope of good in the world. Yet as Christians, we know a stronger kind of love, a love that gives the ultimate sacrifice."
